  - They want to hear and see that you are intelligent and have the ability to make an on-going commitment to corporate goals.
- 2. Who has been an influential role model in your life? And Why?
  - Give this question some thought and how will it be perceived by the interviewer
- 3. Which three words describe you? (Based on your research what do they want to hear?)
  - If you have been listening and researched the company, you will pick up on what they want to hear
- 4. Why do you want to work here?
  - If you haven't done your research that question will become a thorn in your side as will most questions on this list
- 5. What motivates you?
- 6. What did you enjoy most about your last position?
- 7. Why did you choose this field?
- 8. What can you do for us that someone else can't?
- 9. You're overqualified and wouldn't be happy in the position, would you?
- 10. Give me an example of an occasion where you did your best?
- 11. Tell me about 2 or 3 of your recent goals and what you did to achieve them.
- 12. How many books have you read in the last month?
- 13. What do you expect to be doing 5 years from today?
- 14. How do you deal with criticism?
- 15. Give examples of meeting deadlines? Working under pressure? Improving performance?
- 16. How do you set priorities and organize your workday?
- 17. What's your greatest strength?
- 18. What's your greatest weakness?
- 19. What are the qualities of a good manager/sales manager/project manager?
- 20. Recent graduates: What were you favorite classes? Favorite professors?
- 21. How did you balance your studies with other activities?
- 22. What do you expect from this position?
- 23. Why should we hire you?
